This bill identifies additional information required to be provided in the application for dealer registration. It also increases the amount of the required bond to be \$100,000 from the current requirement of \$50,000, and specifies insurance requirements for motor vehicle dealers. The Division of Motor Vehicles does not anticipate any required programming changes to implement the changes this bill makes, and therefore submits a zero fiscal note.
