Analysis

This bill amends AS 04.11.130(e) to remove certain requirements that a brewery must meet in order to sell more than 36 ounces of the brewery's product to a person for consumption on the premises during specific hours of operation.

This bill has no fiscal impact to the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board.
