Analysis

If enacted, this legislation would add fish processors to the listed entities that are exempt from the sick leave requirements of Alaska Statute 23.10.066 – 23.10.068. Seafood processing companies would not have to provide sick leave to seafood processing workers. The exemption would relieve Wage and Hour of the regulatory oversight that currently exists for workers engaged in fish processing in relation to the mandatory sick leave requirements.

The Division does not expect any fiscal impact from this legislation.
