FVF Passenger Service Worker-in-Charge

Minimum Qualifications required to bid, including lateral transfers or downgrades:

- Possession of a valid United States Coast Guard Merchant Mariner's Credential (MMC) with Food Handler
- Possession of a valid Transportation Worker Identification Card (TWIC)
- High Speed Craft Rating Certification
- Possession of Standards of Training, Certification and Watchkeeping for Seafarers Certificate (STCW-95) or STCW certification on the MMC.
The STCW Certification must be endorsed for:
 - Proficiency in the Use of Survival Craft
- Passenger RO/RO Certification including:
 - Crowd Management
 - Crisis Management
 - Vessel Specific Familiarization Training
- Must effectively communicate the Vessel Safety Announcement
- Equal Employment Opportunity (EEO) or Respectful Workplace Certification
- Certified Food Protection Manager certificate, (CFPM)
- Current TAMS or TIPS card
- Basic HCT Curriculum
- Forklift Compliance HCT
- Supervisors HCT
- Security 001, 101 and 201 (web based training)
- Current MPIC and ETT Certificate
- Drug & Alcohol Collection Personnel Training Certificate
- Supervisor Signs & Symptoms Training (Recognizing drug & alcohol use in the workplace)
- Valid Marine Evacuation System Certification
- Valid Driver's License
- Academy for Supervisors
- Purser Training Certificate and Letter of Intent
- 2016 hours (approximately 12 months within the last five years) as a Jr. Purser, Senior Purser or Chief Purser; or Storekeeper, Second Steward or Chief Steward experience with AMHS; or a (RAE) PSW with sign-off sheet and recommendation of a Passenger Services Inspector
- Completion of 14 days of PSWIC Job Shadow
- One AMHS evaluation conducted within the past 6 months by a Chief Steward which indicates acceptable or higher performance level
