FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

BILL NO. HB 178

Analysis

This proposal recognizes individual veterans of military service by allowing the Department of Transportation & Public Facilities to name portions of Alaska roads or bridges in their honor. After the Legislature has commended a nominee submitted for formal recognition, the department may then designate a portion of a road or bridge for a commended individual veteran and make arrangements for the designing and posting of appropriate signs and other markers. The proposal allows the department to accept gifts, donations, and grants for the purpose of establishing and maintaining such signs and markers, and also specifies that the department may only post or maintain a sign or other marker if it has been funded by gifts, donations, or grants received from veterans or veterans' supporters.

Since material and personnel costs are not borne by the department, this proposal creates no fiscal impact.
