FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

Analysis

HB319 reduces the requirement that applicants for renewal of a marijuana establishment license must submit fingerprint cards and fees for a national criminal history record check from annually to every three years.

The Alcohol and Marijuana Control Office (AMCO) collects fingerprint fees from applicants, and forwards them to the Department of Public Safety (DPS) to perform the criminal history record check. AMCO enters into an annual reimbursable service agreement (RSA) with DPS to transfer the collected fingerprint fees. Licenses renew annually on June 30. During the 2017 renewal cycle, AMCO forwarded \$7.6 to DPS for background checks of renewal applications.

There is not an anticipated cost to the department associated with this legislation. If HB319 is enacted, renewals of marijuana licenses will not require the yearly processing of a fingerprint based background check for applicants. Multiple aspects of the commercial marijuana industry in Alaska are still unknown, and the variability of revenues collected for fingerprint fees are not expected to be significant.

At this time, the DPS fee for a fingerprint-based criminal background check is \$47.00 per person. Background checks are required for each individual listed on a marijuana establishment license.
