**House Bill 337**  
**An Act Establishing 4-H Day – Ver. A**  
**Sponsor Statement**

The first thought that comes to mind for many about 4-H is livestock at the State Fair. Although there are many 4-H youth that have livestock or projects shown at the fair, there are many more programs. Alaska has a robust and impactful 4-H program with chapters in all corners of our state. The programs serve our diverse communities by offering youth driven projects and hands-on activities with focus areas such as food security, STEM, health, civic engagement, agricultural skills, fisheries, applied arts and much more. Although a national program, 4-H works through a series of grass-roots networks, driven by local chapters.
