Analysis

CSHB 106 would extend the Alaska Coastal Management Program termination date to July 1, 2017, creates an Alaska Coastal Policy Board of which the Commissioner of Environmental Conservation is a member, allows Local Coastal Districts to adopt new forms of enforceable policies which would result in a series of amendments to District Coastal Management Plans for Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) review and approval, and requires that DEC review local enforceable policies that fall within the agency's jurisdiction and make defensible decisions as to whether to object to those policies.

Fiscal impacts are detailed below:

Personal Services

Implementation of CSHB 106 will require additional work for existing Division of Air Quality staff. Existing Environmental Engineering Associate II (Range 23) staff (likely in Juneau) will be responsible for reviewing and evaluating coastal district plans and their proposed enforceable policies, standards, and requirements; preparing any objections to enforceable policies, new standards, and requirements; and briefing the DEC representative to the Coastal Policy Board on objections to enforceable policies. General funds are requested to pay for this additional work as these existing staff are currently funded by a mix of permit fees and federal grant funds for which this work is not eligible. Existing staff would shift their time out of federally funded work; the federal funds could then be allocated to contracts to assist in completing grant-eligible work.

Contractual

The Division anticipates a small amount of legal review would be required through RSA with the Department of Law.
