**FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS****STATE OF ALASKA  
2016 LEGISLATIVE SESSION****Analysis**

SB18 would exempt Health Care Sharing Ministries from regulation under Title 21. Health Care Sharing Ministries are exempt from insurance regulation in an estimated 27 states. Health Care Sharing Ministries are exempted by the federal government under the Affordable Care Act if they meet certain conditions to provide health care assistance, not insurance, to enrollees.

The Division of Insurance does not anticipate fiscal impact from this legislation.
