Analysis

House Bill 379 eliminates pay step increases for employees in the Judicial Branch, effectively "freezing" their salaries as of July 1, 2016. This fiscal note encompasses the impact to the Alaska Court System, the Judicial Council, and the Commission on Judicial Conduct, and combines OMB components 767, 768, 769, 770, 771, and 2950.

No employees in the judicial branch are covered by collective bargaining agreements. In addition, justices, judges, law clerks, the Administrative Director, and the Deputy Director do not receive pay step increases. This bill therefore affects the wages of every other judicial employee, including clerks and administrators.

Merit and longevity step increases are not funded in the judiciary's base budget; these are absorbed in the judiciary's operations, and are the factors that increase our personal services underfunding each year. We pay these increases to employees by managing open positions, and deliberately holding positions vacant. This note reflects the total impact to the judiciary for FY 17 as \$827,100.
