Analysis

This bill amends AS 44.41 by adding a new section requiring the Department of Public Safety, in cooperation with the Department of Military and Veterans' Affairs, to develop and implement missing vulnerable adult response and notification plans using statewide and local radio and television broadcasters and newspaper publishers.

It is not anticipated that compliance with this legislation will have a fiscal impact on the Division of Alaska State Troopers.
