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Analysis

HB 262 adopts a new crime in Title 11 – interference with access to public buildings or transportation facilities. It would be a class A misdemeanor for a person to deny access to a public building or transportation facility unless the person seeking access submits to a physical pat down or to being subject to an imaging process that exposes the genitals, anus, or female breast or otherwise shows an image of a characteristic normally covered by clothing.

The defense of performance of public duties is not available for this new offense.

Some public buildings are excluded such as correctional facilities. Transportation facility is not defined in the bill.

The fiscal impact to Department of Law is indeterminate
