ANALYSIS CONTINUATION

Note: Costs and implementation dates below are based on a best case scenario of capital funding being available this next fiscal year. However, if funding is not available in FY2010 then all dates of implementation, i.e. capital and operating, will subsequently be pushed out further into the future.

Operating Estimates:

After construction is completed, the department estimates \$250.0 for the state's share of annual operating costs, with the possibility of leveraging additional federal funds for operations and maintenance. The second year of operations reflects a fund source change of \$10.0 from general funds to the new veteran's cemetery fund to reflect estimated receipts from fund for operational costs.

Capital Estimates:

Capital expenditures include costs of site feasibility/testing, design and planning of the project, and land transfer processing, estimated at \$750.0 general fund match; and actual construction costs of \$5 million in federal receipts. The construction costs do not include the cost of the land as proponents of the Interior cemetery are anticipating land donation.

Design goals include offering the most efficient and effective space utilization in all spects of the design concept.

Donated land will be processed by the Dept of Natural Resources at an estimated cost of \$23.0. DMVA is committed to assisting DNR by covering this transfer cost.

The 750.0 GFM in FY2010 is requested for site planning, architectural and design work. This funding availability is required to reflect the state's commitment to future operations and to leverage the \$5 million in federal funds for construction. For discussion purposes, the \$750.0 GFM is reflected as one lump sum in the fiscal note; however, the funding could be spread across three years, but would result in a delay in the ability to leverage the federal funding for construction.

The state has the unique opportunity to leverage federal funding reimbursement in the future to offset operating costs, and \$5 million in constructions costs, contingent upon the state's commitment to ongoing operations and maintenance of the facility. With state funding support, federal funds may be available for community support of the facility as well.
