

# I oppose Right-to-Work “for Less”

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## **Lower Wages**

The average worker in a right-to-work state makes \$5333 a year less than workers in other states, more than 15% less than workers in non right-to-work states. <sup>1</sup>

## **Fewer People with Health Care**

21% percent more people lack health insurance in right-to-work states compared to free-bargaining states. <sup>2</sup>

## **Poverty, Crime, and Public Education**

Right-to-work states have over 2% more people in poverty, violent crimes rates that are 15.4% higher, property crime rates 14.1% higher, and spending on public education is 23.4% less per pupil in right-to-work states. <sup>3</sup>

## **Lower Workers' Compensation Benefits for Workers Injured on the Job**

Maximum weekly worker compensation benefits are \$30 higher in free states (\$609 versus \$579 in right to work states. <sup>4</sup>

## **More Workplace Deaths and Injuries**

According to the federal Bureau of Labor Statistics, the rate of workplace deaths is 51 percent higher in states with right to work, where unions can't speak up on behalf of workers. <sup>5</sup>
