## **ANALYSIS CONTINUATION**

It is expected that 100 of those applications will result in denial/appeal which translates to one full month of Appeals technician time, adding to the backlog that currently exists. OAH typically spends 15-20 hours at \$135 hour per case. This is estimated to increase our costs of Formal hearings by as much as \$27,000 annually. Supply cost is based solely on increased 1099 mailing.

1,750 additional complicated cases annually is not something the division can absorb without increased staffing. At current staffing levels, regular eligiblity casework is not complete for a given year until well into the 4th month of the following year. Applicants who appeal at the informal level can expect resolution of their case to take approximately 8 months.
