ANALYSIS: (Attach a separate page if necessary) HB 138 expands the penalties for most cruelty to animals charges. The fiscal impact to the Department of Law is difficult to predict. In testimony before the Senate Judiciary Committee in 2008 an animal shelter person from Fairbanks said they get 20 cases of cruelty to animals a month. This equals 240 cases a year for a population of 97,970 (US census date for 2008). The same date shows a state population of 686,293. This would mean an annual statewide caseload of approximately 1,608 for cruelty to animals. With the changes of many misdemeanors to a class C felony the state would need at least an additional four to five attorneys. Department of Law numbers should approximate four cases a year hence an indeterminate fiscal note.
