A BILL

To establish a minimum funding level for programs under the Victims of Crime Act of 1984 for fiscal years 2010 to 2014 that ensures a reasonable growth in victim programs without jeopardizing the long-term sustainability of the Crime Victims Fund.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Crime Victims Fund
- 5 Preservation Act of 2009".

SEC. 2. CRIME VICTIMS FUND.

Section 1402(c) of the Victims of Crime Act of 1984 2 3 (42 U.S.C. 10601(c)) is amended— (1) by inserting "(1)" after "(c)"; and 4 5 (2) by adding at the end the following: 6 "(2) The amount made available from the Fund for the purposes of paragraphs (2), (3), and (4) of subsection 8 (d) shall be not less than— "(A) \$705,000,000 for fiscal year 2010; 9 "(B) \$867,150,000 for fiscal year 2011; 10

"(C) \$1,066,594,500 for fiscal year 2012;

"(E) \$1,613,650,819 for fiscal year 2014.".
