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* Sec. 3. FINDINGS. The legislature finds that the State of Alaska has realized savings in the amount of \$106,261,000 during the fiscal year ending June 30, 2010, through the federal medical assistance percentage provisions of P.L. 111-5 (American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009) that are being used to finance appropriations made from the general fund in this Act.

Sec. 4. DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE, COMMUNITY, AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT. The sum of \$250,000 is appropriated from the general fund to the Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development for payment as a grant under AS 37.05.316 to World Trade Center Alaska for the 2010 world expo for the fiscal years ending June 30, 2010, and June 30, 2011.

* Sec. 5. DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS. (a) The sum of \$10,462,600 is appropriated to the Department of Corrections to implement the interest arbitration decision dated March 19, 2009, establishing monetary terms of the collective bargaining agreement with the Alaska Correctional Officers Association, for the fiscal years ending June 30, 2010, and June 30, 2011, from the following sources:

General fund \$10,348,500

Federal receipts 114,100

(b) For (a) of this section, it is the intent of the legislature that

- (1) the Department of Corrections and the Department of Administration take all responsible actions necessary, including shift modification, to mitigate financial and other exposure as a result of the provisions for a 50 percent increase in personal leave accrual in the interest arbitration decision, dated March 19, 2009;
- (2) the Department of Administration, in the conduct of current and future collective bargaining negotiations, refrain from considering the implementation of the Department of Corrections' interest arbitration decision, dated March 19, 2009, as suggestive or indicative of legislative endorsement of the arbitration award provisions for personal leave accrual rates for the Department of Corrections or any other bargained agreements.
- * Sec. 6. DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES. The sum of \$242.72 is appropriated from the general fund to the Department of Health and Social Services, division of juvenile justice, for payment of unpaid bills for services received in 2003 and 2004, for fiscal year ending June 30, 2010.

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* Sec. 7. DEPARTMENT OF LABOR AND WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT. Section 9(d), ch. 14, SLA 2009, is amended to read:

- (d) The unexpended and unobligated balance, not to exceed \$85,000, of the appropriation made in sec. 1, ch. 27, SLA 2008, page 17, lines 4 - 5 (Office of the Governor, branch-wide oil and gas development - \$7,290,800) [PAGE 28, LINE 22, AND ALLOCATED ON LINE 27 (DEPARTMENT OF LABOR AND WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT, WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT, ALASKA WORKFORCE INVESTMENT BOARD - \$543,600)] is reappropriated to the Department of Labor and Workforce Development, Alaska Workforce Investment Board, for gas pipeline activities for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2010.

- * Sec. 9. DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES. (a) The sum of \$40,000 is appropriated from the general fund to the Department of Natural Resources, claims, permits, and leases allocation, for providing trash and sanitation services at Kasilof Beach for the fiscal years ending June 30, 2010, and June 30, 2011.
- (b) The interest earned during the fiscal year ending June 30, 2010, on the reclamation bond posted by Cook Inlet Energy for operation of an oil production platform in Cook Inlet under lease with the Department of Natural Resources, estimated to be \$175,000, is appropriated to the Department of Natural Resources for the purposes of the bond.
- * Sec. 10. DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY. - * Sec. 18. REVENUE AND APPROPRIATION BALANCE; CONSTITUTIONAL BUDGET RESERVE. (a) The amount necessary for full repayment of the amounts owed the budget reserve fund (art. IX, sec. 17, Constitution of the State of Alaska), as of June 30, 2010, estimated to be \$401,617,000, is appropriated from the general fund to the budget reserve fund (art. IX, sec. 17, Constitution of the State of Alaska).
- (b) If the unrestricted state revenue available for appropriation in fiscal year 2010 is insufficient to cover general fund appropriations made for fiscal year 2010, the amount necessary to balance revenue and general fund appropriations is appropriated from the budget reserve fund (AS 37.05.540) to the general fund.

 - (c) The sum of \$1,673,000 is appropriated from the **general fund** [BUDGET RESERVE FUND (ART.
