- 4) Per-student GPS merit award amount is an average of all academic award levels.
- 5) Scholar attrition rate is 25% per year based upon UA five-year graduation rate data.
- 6) Year one participation includes eligible high school graduates from calls of 2010 and 2011

Participation numbers are assumed to be: Year 1=4,034; Year 2=7,059; Year 3=9,076; Year 4=10,084

In 2009, Alaska had 8,008 high school graduates

In Wyoming, approximately 28.8% of graduates utilize the merit scholarship program.

At the same utilization rate, an estimated 2,305 AK high school grads (per class) will earn a scholarship. Assumptions for inclusion of 2010 high school grads are that Year 2 participation rates below are applied

For this analysis, an averaged award level has been used.

According to Education Trust, the average graduation rate after 5 years for UAF is 25% and UAA is 16.5%. The four-year graduation rate is significantly lower.

Assumes average Expected Family Contribution of \$7,500 + \$2,000 required student contribution. This EFC amount relates to an average household income of approximately \$65,000 as calculated through the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA.

The cost of attendance used to estimate average need incorporates an annual growth factor of 6% in standard UA costs of attendance.

Regarding the one temporary position--that relates to inclusion of the 2010 high school graduating class. Because the students' high school transcripts will have already been finalized, a separate, manual process will be needed to assess Class of 2010 graduates' eligibility. We anticipate the need for one person with the skills and abilities to evaluate transcripts and course information against established criteria. This position is a range 21 and would be a long-term, nonperm position with a duration of 12-18 months.
