ANALYSIS: (Attach a separate page if necessary) House Bill 381 expands the places from which a person need not retreat before using deadly force in self-defense to any place the person has a right to be. Thus, even though a person knows that with complete safety to oneself and others the person can leave the area of the encounter, the person is justified in using deadly force if the person is in a place the person has a right to be. This bill will make prosecution of homicide cases more difficult for the prosecution, and it will probably result in more jury trials. The Criminal Division anticipates it would need 2 new FTE attorney positions to handle the increased cases, to both screen referrals and prosecute those that are accepted.
