## House Bill 351 Police Officer Protections/Certification Sectional Analysis

- **Section 1**: Establishes guidelines for the process for the Police Officer Standards Council to suspend, revoke or refuse to issue a certificate to a police officer who does not meet the standards adopted by the council. Requires a hearing and decision prior to revocation or refusal to issue a certificate.
- **Section 2**: Provides that, in a hearing required by section 1 of this bill, misconduct must be proven by clear and convincing evidence.
- **Section 3**: Prohibits suspension, revocation or refusal to issue a certificate based on a previous disciplinary action that has been reversed or removed.
- Section 4: Adds court officers to the definition of "police officer."
- **Section 5**: Prohibits retaliation for a police officer who refuses to submit to a lie detector test.
- **Section 6**: Allows a police officer to refuse to take a lie detector test and specifies that the request and refusal are confidential and cannot be made part of the officer's personnel file or employment record.
- **Section 7**: States that information that "personally identifies a police officer," including a photo or home address, is confidential and specifies the limited conditions when the information can be released.
- **Section 8**: Repeals AS 23.10.037 (b), which allows an employer to request that a police officer or an applicant to be a police officer submit to a lie detector test.
- **Section 9**: Immediate effective date.
