This legislation would require the Medicaid program to cover naturopathy services. The Department does not anticipate increased expenditures of Medicaid services because naturopathy services would largely replace other covered services, and any increase in total covered services would be offset by payment of naturopaths at a lower rate than physicians. However, there would be a one-time cost to make system changes to the MMIS, the Department's Medicaid claims processing system. The Department assumes that it will receive 50 percent federal funding to make changes to its legacy MMIS.
