BILL NO. HB 122

Analysis

HB 122 amends AS 08.45 to establish the Alaska Naturopathic Medical Board and expands the scope of practice of Naturopaths to allow prescriptive authority through a prescription endorsement and to require proof of continuing education prior to license renewal.

The program is required to cover its cost with licensing fees under AS 08.01.065, and revenue generated by program fee must cover its full operating costs. HB 122 is expected to increase costs by \$48.9 the first year and \$43.9 annually thereafter. Naturopathic licensing fees will increase an estimated 700% to cover these new program operating costs.

The following is an analysis of the cost to implement HB 122:

Personnel Services of \$33.8 is for one (1) part-time Occupational Licensing Examiner position, Range 13, to staff the Board. A position is needed to support Board activities by keeping the official records and providing administrative support to the Board and the licensing program.

Travel of \$7.0 will cover five board members and one staff to meet twice a year in accordance with Section 4 of the bill, AS 08.45.003(b). The estimated travel costs assume one meeting is held in Anchorage and one held in Juneau.

Services of \$2.1 covers the costs of notices of meetings, regulations, legal review of regulations, communications, and printing expenses.

Commodities of \$6.0 consist of one time set up costs and on-going standard operating supplies.

Revenue will be generated from license and endorsement fees. The bill is set to take effect July 1, 2011. Current Naturopath licenses are due to expire on March 31, 2012.
