FOR AN ACT ENTITLED

"An Act relating to naturopaths and to the practice of naturopathy; establishing an Alaska Naturopathic Medical Board; authorizing medical assistance program coverage of naturopathic services; and providing for an effective date."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

- * **Section 1.** AS 08.01.010(25) is amended to read:
 - (25) <u>Alaska Naturopathic Medical Board (AS 08.45.003)</u>
 [REGULATION OF THE PRACTICE OF NATUROPATHY UNDER AS 08.45];
- * Sec. 2. AS 08.01.050(d) is amended to read:
 - (d) At the request of one of the following boards, the department may contract with public agencies and private professional organizations to provide assistance and treatment to persons licensed by the board who abuse alcohol, other drugs, or other substances:
 - (1) Board of Social Work Examiners;
 - (2) Board of Dental Examiners;

- (d) Three members of the board constitute a quorum for the transaction of all business properly before the board.
- (e) When appointing naturopaths under (a) of this section, the governor may consider licensed naturopaths who have been nominated by the Alaska Association of Naturopathic Physicians.
- (f) In the event of the death, resignation, or removal of a member, the vacancy shall be filled for the unexpired portion of the term in the same manner as the original appointment.

Sec. 08.45.005. Duties of the board. The board shall

- (1) adopt continuing education requirements for licensed naturopaths that include mandatory pharmaceutical education;
- (2) prescribe the content, duration, and methodology of training programs that will satisfy the continuing education requirements adopted by the board;
- (3) approve training programs that meet the continuing education requirements adopted by the board;
- (4) adopt regulations necessary to implement this chapter and to protect public health; and
- (5) define by regulation "physician-patient relationship" for purposes of AS 08.45.045(5).

* **Sec. 5.** AS 08.45.030 is amended to read:

- Sec. 08.45.030. Issuance of license. The <u>board shall</u> [DEPARTMENT SHALL] issue a license to practice naturopathy to an applicant who provides proof satisfactory to the <u>board</u> [DEPARTMENT] that the applicant has received a degree from an accredited four-year college or university, <u>has paid the applicable fees</u>, and
- (1) on or before December 31, 1987, has graduated from a school of naturopathy that required four years of attendance at the school and after graduation has received a license in another state after passing an examination for licensure in that state and is licensed by a state at the time of application; or
 - (2) after December 31, 1987, has
 - (A) graduated from a school of naturopathy that required four years of attendance at the school and at the time of graduation the school was

accredited or a candidate for accreditation by the Council on Naturopathic Medical Education or a successor organization recognized by the United States Department of Education; and

- (B) passed the Naturopathic Physicians Licensing Examination.

 - (1) has paid the applicable fees;
 - (2) meets the requirements of AS 08.45.030(2)(A); and
 - (3) [(2)] has not previously failed the Naturopathic Physicians Licensing Examination.

Sec. 08.45.045. Scope of practice as a naturopath. A naturopath may

- (1) use physical examinations consistent with naturopathic medical education and training for diagnostic purposes;
- (2) perform and administer therapies consistent with naturopathic medical education and training, including intravenous delivery of dietetic substances;
- (3) order or conduct medical imaging and laboratory examinations consistent with naturopathic medical education and training;
- (4) perform preemployment, school, and workplace health examinations; and
- (5) subject to AS 08.45.050, administer and prescribe prescription drugs, vaccines, hormones, and medical devices for a person with whom the naturopath has a physician-patient relationship as defined by the board in regulations.

Sec. 08.45.058. Continuing education requirements. (a) For each biennial license period, a person licensed to practice naturopathy under AS 08.45.030 shall complete and submit to the board evidence that the licensee satisfied the continuing education requirements adopted by the board under AS 08.45.005.

- (b) The department shall publish, on a regular basis, a listing of training programs that may be used to satisfy the continuing education requirements of this section.

Sec. 08.45.060. Grounds for suspension, revocation, or refusal to issue a license. The <u>board</u> [DEPARTMENT] may, after a hearing, impose a disciplinary sanction on a person licensed under this chapter when the <u>board</u> [DEPARTMENT] finds that the licensee

- (1) secured a license through deceit, fraud, or intentional misrepresentation;
- (2) engaged in deceit, fraud, or intentional misrepresentation in the course of providing professional services or engaging in professional activities;
 - (3) advertised professional services in a false or misleading manner;
- (4) has been convicted of a felony or other crime that affects the licensee's ability to continue to practice competently and safely;
- (5) failed to comply with this chapter, with a regulation adopted under this chapter, or with an order of the **board** [DEPARTMENT];

Sec. 08.45.200. Definitions. In this chapter,

- "board" means the Alaska Naturopathic Medical Board (1) created in AS 08.45.003;
- "controlled substance" means a substance classified as a **(2)** controlled substance in federal law or in a schedule set out in AS 11.71.140 -11.71.190 [HAS THE MEANING GIVEN IN AS 11.71.900];
- "department" means the Department of Commerce, **(3)** [(2)] Community, and Economic Development;
- "naturopathy" means the use of hydrotherapy, dietetics, **(4)** [(3)] electrotherapy, sanitation, suggestion, mechanical and manual manipulation for the stimulation of physiological and psychological action to establish a normal condition of mind and body; in this paragraph, "dietetics" includes herbal and homeopathic remedies.

 - Sec. 08.80.400. Other licensees not affected. TRANSITIONAL PROVISIONS APPLICABLE TO ALASKA NATUROPATHIC MEDICAL BOARD. Notwithstanding AS 08.45.003, enacted in sec. 4 of this Act, the terms of the first members of the Alaska Naturopathic Medical Board appointed by the governor are as follows: one licensed naturopath member and the licensed pharmacist member shall be appointed for three-year terms; one licensed naturopath member and the public member shall be appointed for two-year terms; and one licensed naturopath member shall be appointed for a one-year term. The governor shall specify the term of office of each licensed naturopath member appointed subject to this section.

TRANSITIONAL PROVISIONS AFFECTING EXISTING LICENSEES. Notwithstanding AS 08.45.030, as amended by sec. 5 of this Act, and AS 08.45.035(a), as amended by sec. 6 of this Act,

- (1) a license issued under those provisions by the Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development before the effective date of this section is valid for the period issued until renewal under the provisions of this Act; and
- (2) the Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development, without prior approval of the Alaska Naturopathic Medical Board, may issue a license or renew a license to practice naturopathy on or after the effective date of this section and until the day before the effective date of the regulations initially adopted by the board setting out procedures under which license applications and renewals are submitted for board review and approval.
