STATE OF ALASKA 2011 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

BILL NO. HB023

Analysis

HB 23 adds a section to statute that would make installation of computer keystroke loggers or devices or programs that have the ability to record another person's keystrokes or entries or enables on a computer a program to record keystrokes wirelessly or by nonwired means a class C felony.

The average sentence for a class C felony is 122 days. This legislation, if passed, would result in an increase in arrests and an increase in the number of offenders being housed at Department of Corrections facilities.

However, the Department of Corrections is unable to determine the fiscal impact of this legislation, as we cannot estimate the total number of violations of this law that will occur.
