CSSB 92 (L&C) DENTISTS/DENTAL HYGIENISTS/ASSISTANTS

Changes from the Original Bill

- **Sec. 1.** No change.
- **Sec. 2.** Clarifies that the educational program requirement for a license be at least two years and accredited at the time of graduation.
- **Sec. 3.** Re-establishes that fees will be set by the Department of Commerce, Community and Economic Development (maintains the status quo).
- Sec. 4. No change.
- Sec. 5. Expands the means by which the department must notify a license holder that the license will soon expire. The original bill required mailing; the CS does not specify a method, thereby allowing electronic communications.
- Sec. 6. No change.
- Sec. 7 and 8. Clarify that an accredited program is what is meant, not a school; programs are accredited, not schools.
- Sec. 9. Clarifies that (a)(1)(A) refers to a treatment plan for dental hygiene.
- Sec. 10. Adds the word "comprehensive" to the term treatment plan to conform to standard usage within the profession.
- Sec. 11. No change.
- Sec. 12. Clarifies that (a)(6) refers to a treatment plan for dental hygiene.
- Sec. 13 15. No change.

Sec. 16. Adds language intended to except dental hygienists working for Alaska Native organizations. NOTE: This language overlooks current practice in rural areas where such clinics serve people who are not Alaska Natives. The Senate L&C Committee proposes an amendment that will clarify that current practice would be allowed under the bill.

Sec. 17 - 19. No change.

Sec. 20. A new section specifying that the president of the board must be either a licensed dentist or dental hygienist.

Sec. 21 - 33 (old 20 - 32). No change.

Sec. 34 (old 33). Clarifies that an accredited program is what is meant, not a school; programs are accredited, not schools.

Sec. 35 (old 34). Removes the requirement that a student dental assistant be enrolled in an accredited program.

Sec. 36 (old 35). Extends the time certain persons may retain ownership interest in a clinic or dental office after the death of a previous owner.

Sec. 37 - 39 (old 36 - 38). No change.
