### Analysis

HB 224 amends the minor offense criminal statute AS 11.76.100 ("Selling or giving tobacco to a minor," defined in the statute as anyone under 19). The bill broadens the statute and its title to include the negligent sale to a minor of any product containing nicotine, not just tobacco, adding an exception for nicotine products approved by the FDA for, and marketed solely as, tobacco cessation uses (e.g., nicotine gum, patches, lozenges) if prescribed by a physician or given to the minor by a parent or guardian.

There is no anticipated fiscal impact to Department of Law.
