FOR AN ACT ENTITLED

2 informative summary required for the proposed adoption, amendment, or repeal of a

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

5 * Section 1. AS 24.08 is amended by adding a new section to read:

6	Sec. 24.08.045. Bills authorizing regulations. A bill that directs an agency to
7	adopt regulations must set a specific time by which the regulations must be adopted.
8	* Sec. 2. AS 44.62.200(a) is amended to read:
9	(a) The notice of proposed adoption, amendment, or repeal of a regulation
10	must include
11	(1) a statement of the time, place, and nature of proceedings for
12	adoption, amendment, or repeal of the regulation;
13	(2) reference to the authority under which the regulation is proposed
14	and a reference to the particular code section or other provisions of law that are being

1 implemented, interpreted, or made specific; 2 (3) an informative summary of the proposed subject of agency action; 3 if the proposed agency action is to amend or repeal an existing regulation, the 4 informative summary must include a summary of the existing regulation as well 5 as a summary of the change proposed by the amendment or repeal; the 6 informative summary shall be written in clear, easily readable language that a 7 person without a legal background is able to understand; 8 (4) other matters prescribed by a statute applicable to the specific 9 agency or to the specific regulation or class of regulations; 10 (5) a summary of the fiscal information required to be prepared under 11 AS 44.62.195. 12 * Sec. 3. The uncodified law of the State of Alaska is amended by adding a new section to 13 read: 14 APPLICABILITY. AS 24.08.045, enacted by sec. 1 of this Act, applies to bills that 15 are filed on or after the effective date of this Act.
