BILL NO. HB 229

Analysis

HB 229 will allow registered guides to act as a class-A assistant in game management units where the guides have not passed a certification exam.

This bill also aligns the statute with regulatory changes, will increase the consequences for operating with an expired license, and provides for other changes regarding the administration and licensing of guides. The department does not anticipate any fiscal impact associated with this legislation.
