

## **AKEELA TREATMENT OUTCOME STATISTICS**

### **Community-Based Substance Abuse Programs**

#### **Outpatient Programs (2013 Data)**

(Length of Treatment: Three to six months in treatment)

Results based on follow-up contact with clients who were four to six months post-treatment.

At time of Admission, clients in these programs generally report the following:

- Drug-use only - 25%
- Alcohol-use only - 20%
- Uses both alcohol & Drugs - 55%
- Approximately 95% of them had legal involvement upon entering treatment\*

At time of Follow-Up contact, clients reported the following:

- 100% were drug-free
- 87.5% were alcohol free
- 91% were living in private residences (homes, apartments, or trailer homes)
- 40% were employed
- 92% no longer had any legal involvement\*

#### **Inpatient Programs (2013 Data)**

(Length of Treatment: six to 12 months in treatment)

Results based on contact with clients who were 12 to 24 months post-treatment.

At time of Admission, clients in these programs generally report the following:

- Drug-use only - 5%
- Alcohol-use only - 20%
- Uses both alcohol & drugs - 75%
- Approximately 98% had legal involvement upon entering treatment\*

At time of Follow-Up contact, clients reported the following:

- 100% were drug-free
- 98.75% were alcohol-free
- 87.5% were living in private residences (homes, apartment, or trailer homes)
- 75% were employed
- 87.5% no longer had any legal involvement\*

### **Corrections Substance Use Disorder Treatment Programs (2012 Data)**

DOC Recidivism rates (percent of offenders returning to incarceration after discharge):

- 3 Years after discharge: 54% with treatment verses 68% no treatment = 14% reduction.
- 2 Years after discharge: 35% with treatment verses 61% no treatment = 26% reduction.
- 1 Year after discharge: 12% with treatment verses 36% no treatment = 24% reduction.

*Alaska is exceeding the 9 to 12% national average for recidivism reduction.*

\*The legal involvement includes OCS involved families in which the State has taken custody of the children.
