Analysis

HB240 extends the existing Board of Chiropractic Examiners through June 30, 2022. Adoption of the bill will continue existing activities by the board. Failure to adopt the bill will result in a one-year wind-down of the board, and the division will assume all licensing responsibility in FY2016.

Cost estimates are based on FY2012 and FY2013 averaged direct actual costs for this biennial Chiropractic program.

The total average annual direct expense of the board and program was \$65.2, \$45.8 personal services, for staff such as licensing examiners and investigators, \$15.0 travel, 4.1 services and \$.2 supplies

If the board sunsets, the following costs would cease: travel of \$15.0 for board members and one staff to attend four board meetings per year, and board travel to professional licensing conferences and training; services costs of \$1.5 for professional licensing conferences and training registration fees, and \$.1 for advertising public notice of board meetings annually.

The remaining direct costs will continue in order to administer the Chiropractic Examiners licensing program.
