



Priority by Fund Source






Return to Alaskans

Other Budget Changes

- » Organizational changes: move Tobacco, EMS, and Community Health Grants into managing components to improve efficiency.
- » Fund changes to re-align authority with earned revenues.
- » Reduce expenditure level & delete long-term vacant positions.

Tobacco Decrement

- » \$1.6 million decrement in FY15 proposed
- » \$746.0 decrement in FY14
- » Stable and sustainable funding essential to ongoing efforts
- » Carry forward projections show \$12.1 million in FY2015 and \$10.7 million by FY2022.






