Analysis

HJR 17 would place the language establishing the earnings reserve account of the Alaska Permanent Fund in the Constitution. It would also place language that establishes the Permanent Fund Dividend in the Constitution. At present, the language authorizing both of these items is contained in Alaska Statutes.
