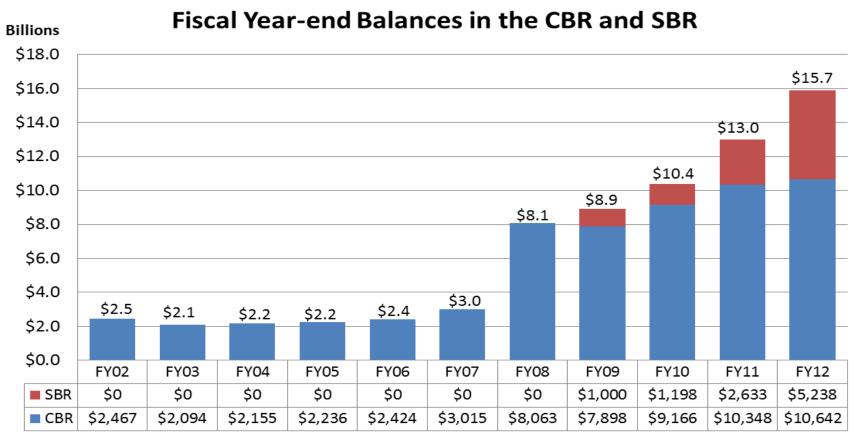

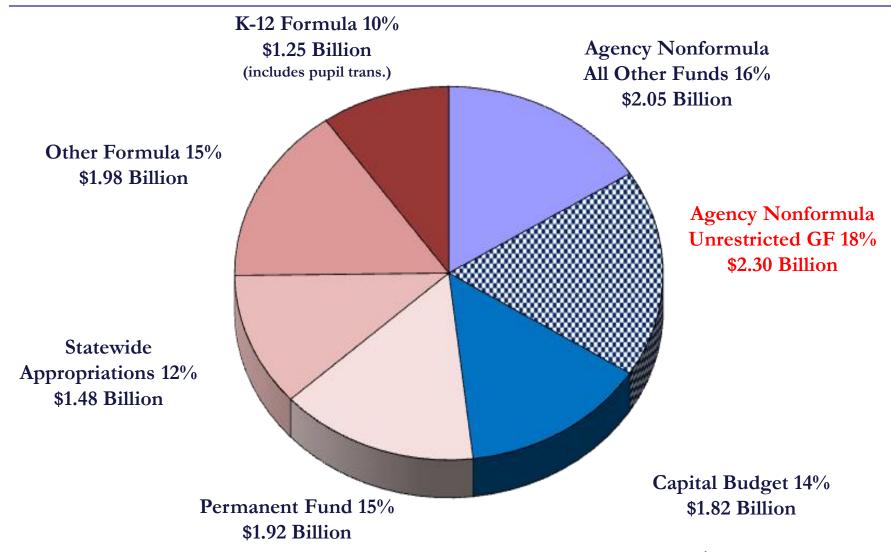

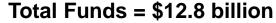

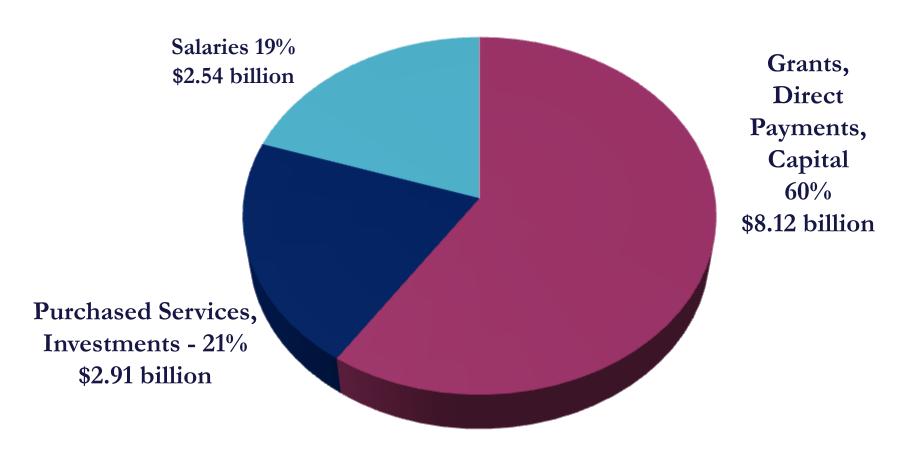
### FY2014 Expenditures by Category
