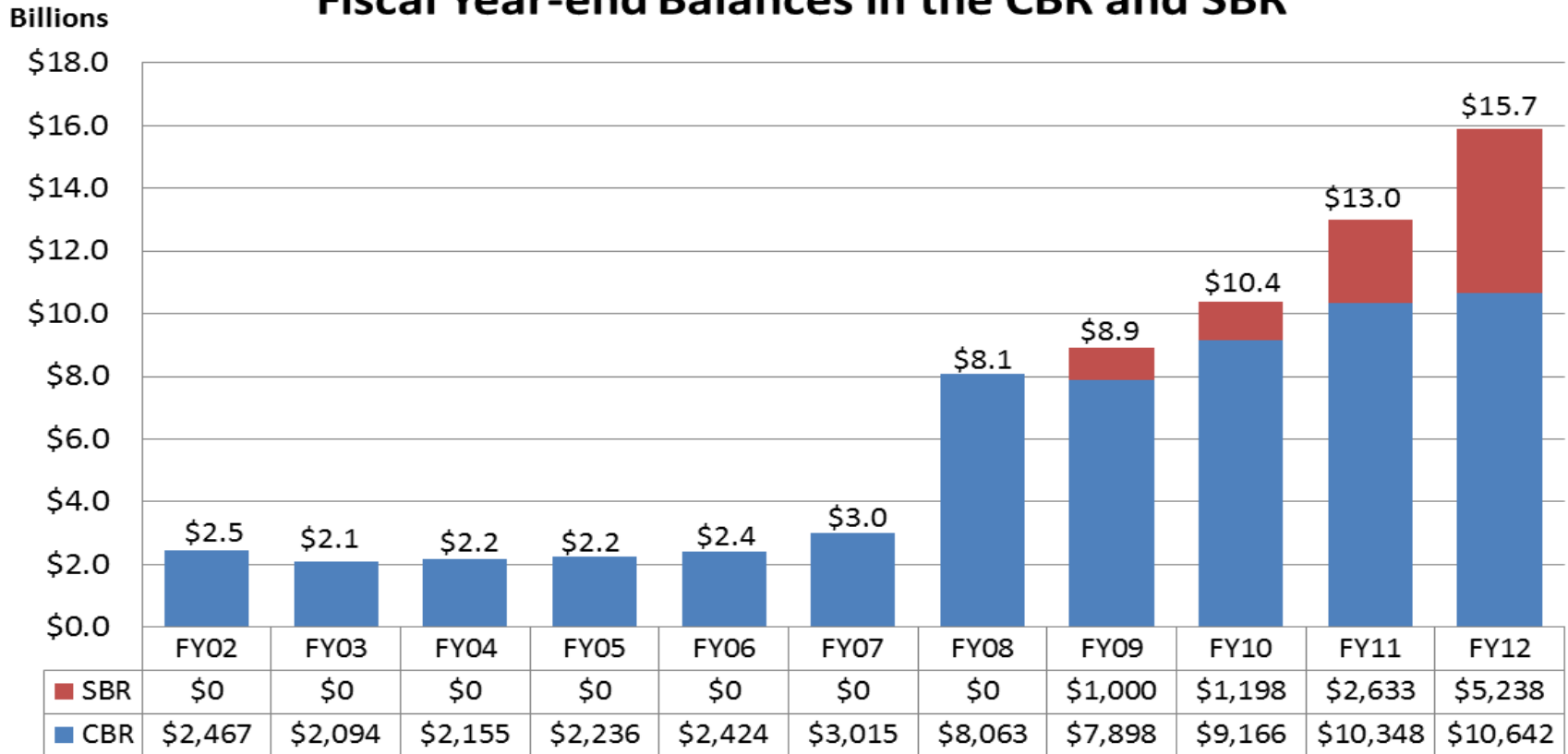
*Spending includes a \$250 million early deposit to the SBR. Total net projected draw from SBR would be -\$160.8.

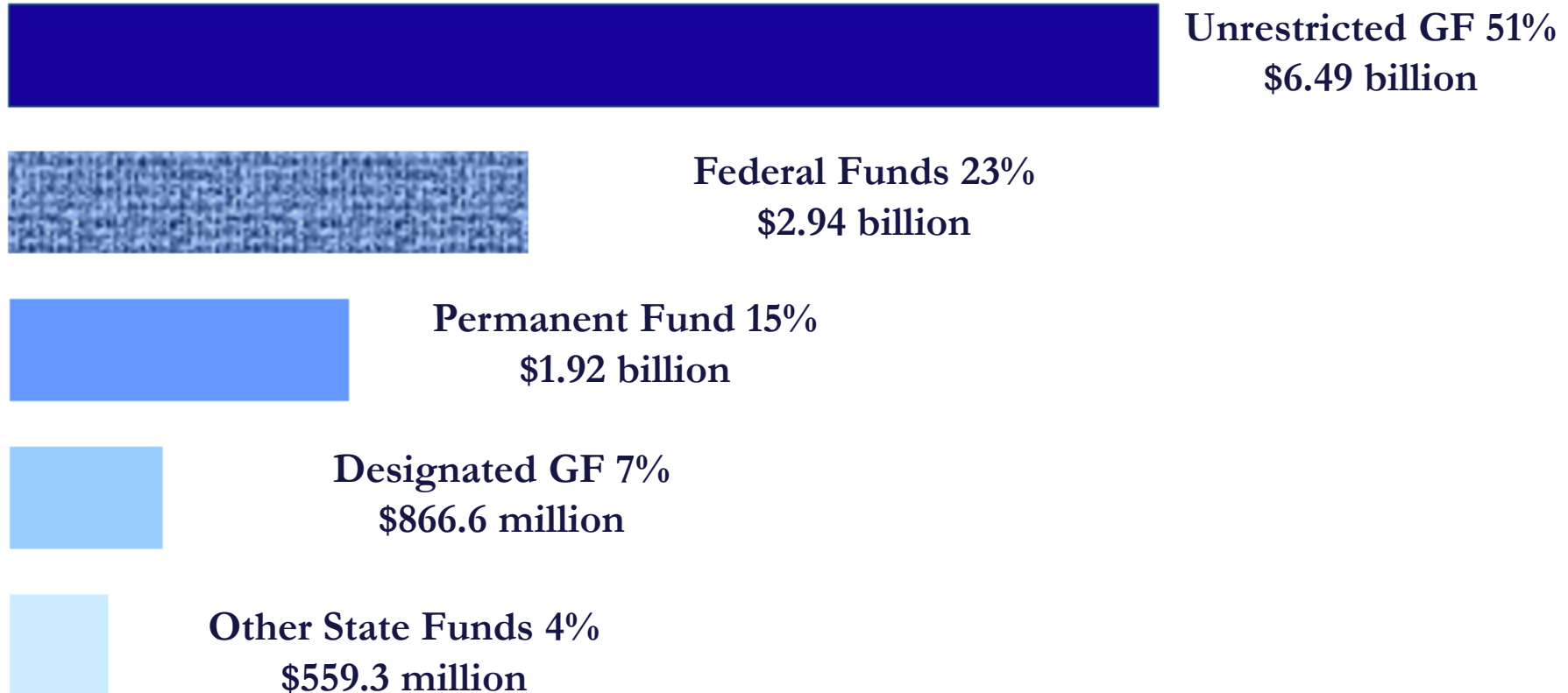

FY2014 Budget Priorities

Build and Maintain Alaska's Infrastructure

- **Transportation/Infrastructure**

Over \$1 billion for Statewide infrastructure projects

- Highways and Aviation \$971.3 million
- Village Safe Water \$56.5 million
- Municipal Water & Sewer \$34.0 million

Schools

- Construction \$46.2 million
- Major maintenance \$22.3 million

Deferred Maintenance \$100.0 million



FY2014 Budget Priorities

Jobs for Alaskans

- **Resources and Permitting**
 - Gasline development \$50.0 million
 - Geologic Material Center \$15.0 million
 - Permitting and Statewide Digital Mapping \$7.3 million
 - Roads to resources \$18.0 million



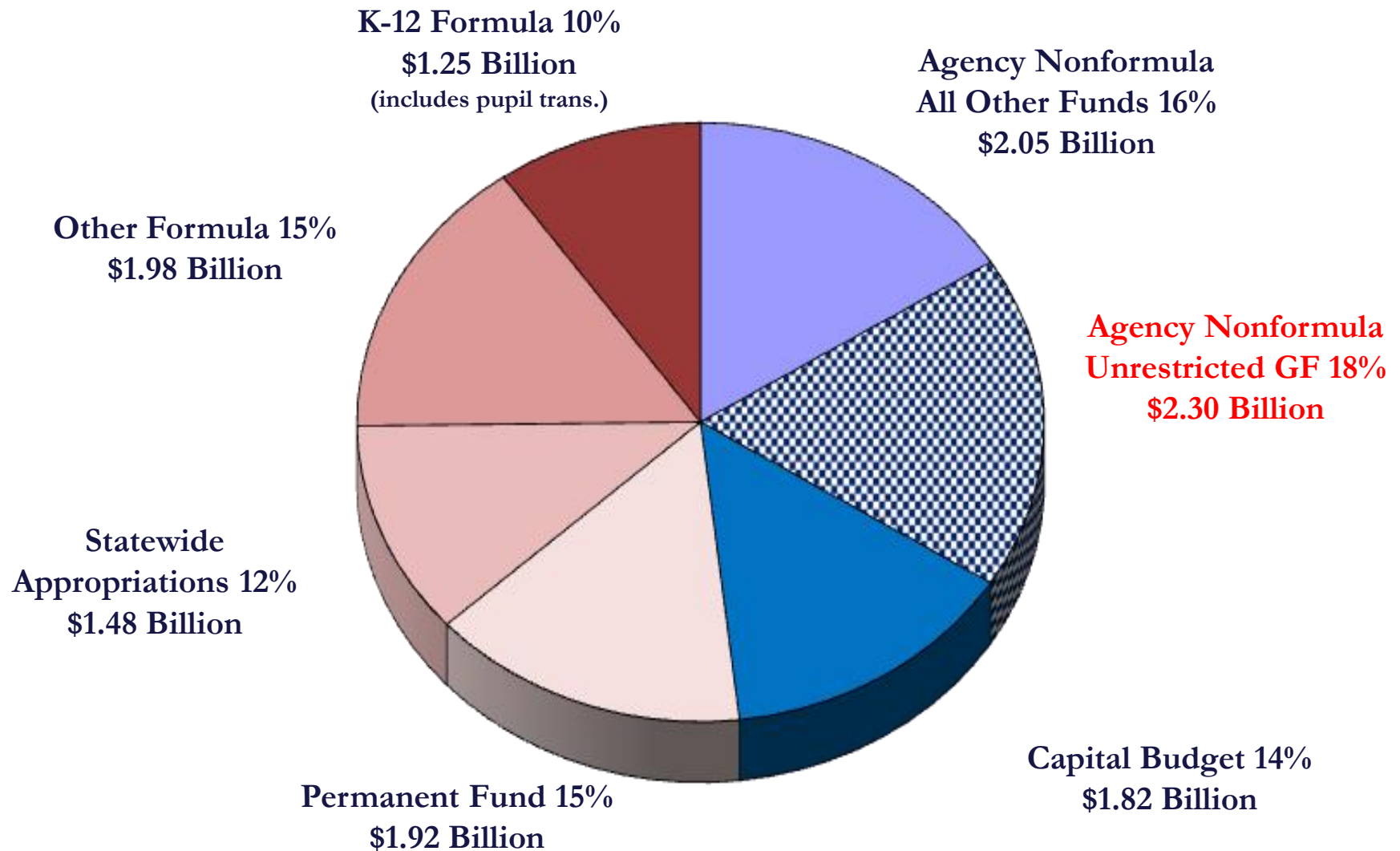
FY2014 Operating Budget Highlights

Restrain growth

- Fully fund K-12 Education and Pupil Transportation \$1.2 billion
- Retirement unfunded liability \$633.8 million
- Community Revenue Sharing \$60.0 million



FY2014 Expenditures by Category

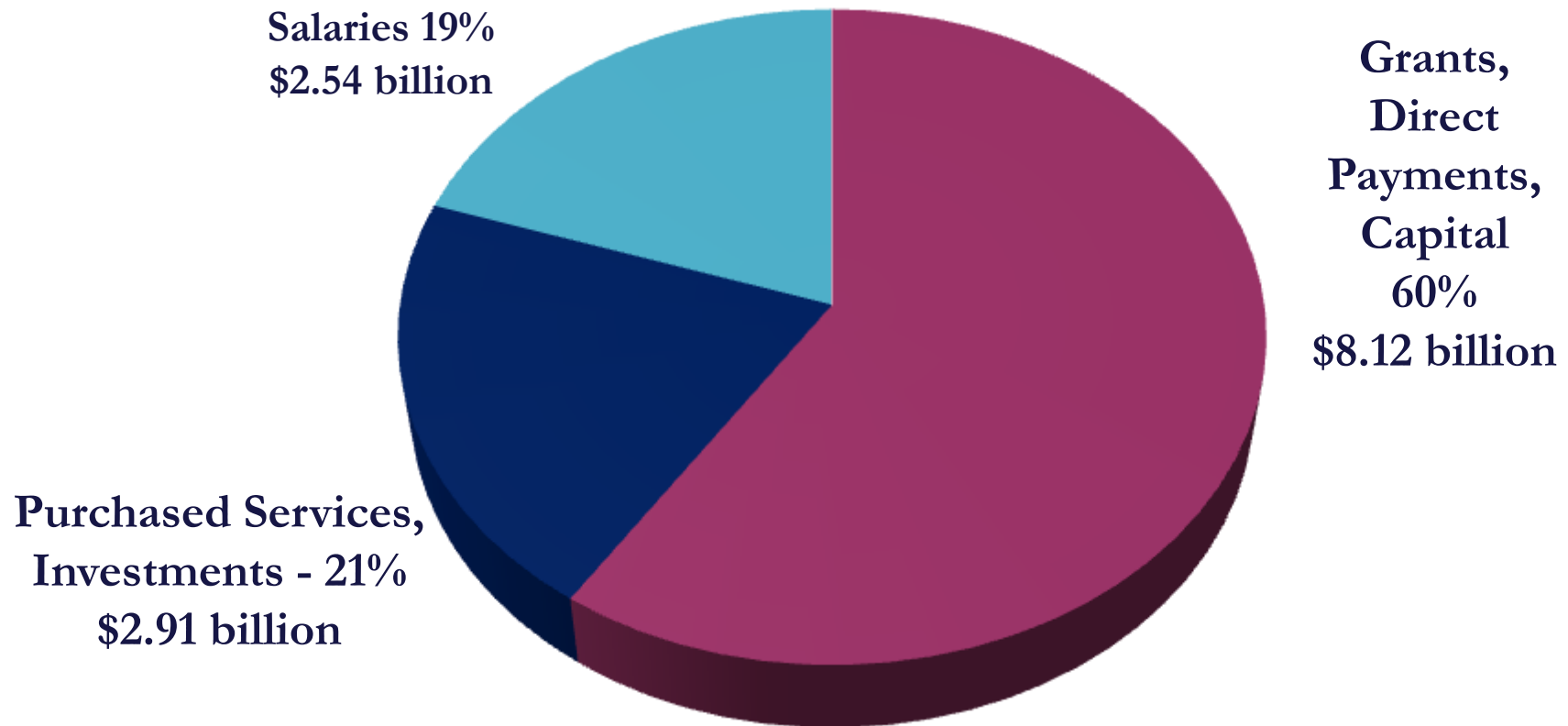


Total Funds = \$12.8 billion
