FOR AN ACT ENTITLED

- 1 "An Act raising the application fee for a drawing permit for the hunting of bison to \$20; 2 requiring the game management plan for bison in the Delta Junction Bison Range Area 3 to include mitigation of bison damage to farm crops and farm and personal property; 4 and authorizing the commissioner of natural resources to make grants to mitigate or 5 prevent damage caused by bison." 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:
