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FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA 2014 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

BILL NO. HB 300

Analysis

HB 300 would allow air ambulance providers to offer air ambulance membership agreements to Alaskans if certain criteria is met by the provider.

HB 300 would amend AS 18.08 to add the following new sections /chapters to regulate air ambulance membership agreements in Alaska:

AS 18.08 - An Air Ambulance Service company may not deny such services to anyone on the basis that the person is not covered under an air ambulance membership agreement for protection of consumers to assure access to emergency service.

AS 21 - Chapter 61 added to define air ambulance membership agreements, describe registration of air ambulance membership service providers, other applicable provisions, regulation adoption authority, and to provide definitions of terms.

The Division of Insurance does not anticipate HB 300 will result in any financial impact to the Division.
