The state provides general funds for selected vaccines for underinsured children, and under- and uninsured adults a result of HB310, passed by the 27th Legislature (Ch. 24 SLA 12). The intent of HB310 was to provide temporary fund FY2013-2015 to purchase vaccines while a long-term sustainable solution could be found. Section 6 of this bill trans remaining \$4,496.0 GF unobligated funds from HB310 for FY2015 into the new vaccine assessment account created bill. This is to seed the new statewide vaccination program. This amount, in combination with federal funds, and other funds of \$700.0, will provide adequate cash flow until the initial assessment fees are collected.
