Analysis

Risk Management (RM) would not be financially impacted by this proposed legislation.		
This bill amends AS 23.30.097 to recalculate how the medical fee schedule is currently be calculated. Section 1, (A)(B)(C), states the fee schedule is the be based on Medicare and Medicaid Services, usng the resource-based relative value scale. This section of the bill if passed would take effect January 1, 2015 per Section 6. This new language should give the Alaska Worker's Compensation Board (AWCB) the authority to adjust medical costs for workers' compensation claims to be more in line with medical costs associated with health care providers.		
Section 3 adds (h) through (m) to state the fee schedule will be reviewed annually and adjusted using a conversion factor established by the board and adopted in regulation.		
Section 5 and section 7 of the bill revert the new fee schedule in section 1 back to the current language. RM anticipates there might be a temporary reduction in medical costs based on the language in Section 1, because it will sunset, the cost savings would only exist until January 1, 2019. RM therefore submits a zero fiscal note.
