All aircraft fly with teams of two nurses certified in advanced cardiac life support, advanced trauma life support, pediatric advanced life support, trauma nursing care, neonatal resuscitation, critical care nursing, emergency nursing and flight nursing. This level of expertise is unique in the air medical industry and comparable to that found in a hospital intensive care unit. Airlift Northwest meets and exceeds all standards of care for air medical transport services and is accredited by the Commission on Accreditation of Medical Transport Services. Airlift Northwest is committed to the region and provides a substantial amount of financial assistance to a Mission of Caring fund for those in need.

Currently there are 4,066 members throughout SE Alaska and 23,901 in Washington.

AirCare is a membership program that provides patients with high-quality air medical transport services at an affordable cost. Lifesaving air medical transport can be expensive and insurances may not cover all costs. As an AirCare member, only your insurance company receives a bill. Airlift Northwest works directly with your insurance company for claims processing. The AirCare membership program is secondary to all payers. The purpose of the AirCare membership is to cover the deductible and coinsurance amounts that may not be covered by the primary payer.
