# FOR AN ACT ENTITLED

"An Act repealing the secondary student competency examination and related requirements; and providing for an effective date."

# **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:**

\* Section 1. AS 14.03.078 is amended to read:

**Sec. 14.03.078. Report.** The department shall provide to the legislature by February 15 of each year an annual report regarding the progress of each school and school district toward high academic performance by all students. The report required under this section must include

(1) information described under AS 14.03.120(d);

(f) In the accountability system for schools and districts required by this section, the department shall

(1) implement 20 U.S.C. 6301 - 7941 (Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965), as amended;

(2) implement state criteria and priorities for accountability including

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the use of 1 2 (A) measures of student performance on standards-based assessments in reading, writing, and mathematics [, AND INCLUDING 3 COMPETENCY TESTS REQUIRED UNDER AS 14.03.075]; 4 (B) measures of student improvement; and 5 (C) other measures identified that are indicators of student 6 7 success and achievement; and (3) to the extent practicable, minimize the administrative burden on 8 9 districts. 10 \* Sec. 4. AS 14.03.255(a) is amended to read: 11 (a) A charter school operates as a school in the local school district except that 12 the charter school (1) is exempt from the local school district's textbook, program, 13 curriculum, and scheduling requirements; (2) is exempt from AS 14.14.130(c); the 14 principal of the charter school shall be selected by the academic policy committee and 15 shall select, appoint, or otherwise supervise employees of the charter school; and (3) 16 operates under the charter school's annual program budget as set out in the contract 17 between the local school board and the charter school under (c) of this section. A local 18 school board may exempt a charter school from other local school district 19 requirements if the exemption is set out in the contract. The uncodified law of the State of Alaska is amended by adding a new section to 24 read: 25 RETROSPECTIVE ISSUANCE OF A HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA. (a) At the 26 request of a student made by June 30, 2017, a school district shall issue a high school diploma 27 to a student who did not receive a high school diploma because the student failed to pass all or 28 a portion of the secondary school competency examination but who received a certificate of 29 achievement under former AS 14.03.075. A school district shall mail a notice consistent with 30 this section to each student who qualifies for a diploma under this section to the student's last 31 known address.

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(b) The Department of Education and Early Development shall post a notice consistent with this section on the department's Internet website with information about how to request a high school diploma.

(c) In this section, "school district" has the meaning given in AS 14.30.350.\* Sec. 7. This Act takes effect immediately under AS 01.10.070(c).
