A RESOLUTION

1 Proclaiming April 2014 as Child Abuse Prevention Month.

2 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

- WHEREAS, in fiscal year 2013, the Department of Health and Social Services,
- 4 Office of Children's Services, received more than 40,000 reports of harm involving tens of
- 5 thousands of children; and
- 6 WHEREAS, of the 40,000 reports of harm received in 2013, 5,000 were substantiated
- 7 reports of child abuse or neglect equating to an average of 13 children a day who were abused
- 8 or neglected in the state in 2013; and
- 9 **WHEREAS** more than 2,000 children in the state reside in foster homes; and
- 10 **WHEREAS** child abuse and neglect leave cross-generational damage resulting in
- approximately 30 percent of abused or neglected children who will grow up to abuse or
- 12 neglect their children; and
- WHEREAS 37 percent of all women in prison and 14 percent of all men in prison
- were abused or neglected as children; and
- WHEREAS the long-term effects of child abuse include improper brain formation, an
- 16 inability to trust, low self-esteem, and an increased vulnerability to post-traumatic stress

1	disorder, sexually transmitted diseases, heart disease, cancer, and depression; and
2	WHEREAS every child deserves a loving family, a safe home, and the opportunity to
3	grow into an upstanding and responsible member of society; and
4	WHEREAS we must work together to support the efforts of all those who take
5	children into their homes and hearts because the community as a whole suffers in every case
6	of child abuse and neglect;
7	BE IT RESOLVED that the Alaska State Legislature proclaims April 2014 to be
8	Child Abuse Prevention Month in the state; and be it
9	FURTHER RESOLVED that the Alaska State Legislature supports and encourages
10	the residents of the state to support child abuse prevention and education efforts.
