The state provides general funds for selected vaccines for underinsured children, and under- and uninsured adults as a result of HB310, passed by the 27th Legislature (Ch. 24 SLA 12). The intent of HB310 was to provide temporary funding from FY2013-2015 to purchase vaccines while a long-term sustainable solution could be found. This bill repeals HB 310 and deposits the remaining unobligated funds into a new vaccine assessment account created by the the bill. The UGF in this fiscal note comes from Epidemiology (currently in the Governor's request) and the program receipts are the estimated vaccine assessment fees.
