Analysis

House Bill 362 provides for a prohibition on the offer, display, marketing, advertising for sale, or sale of illicit drugs. The overall intent of this bill is to place prohibitions on the marketing and sale of a wide and growing number of illicit synthetic drugs, thereby reducing the harmful effects of these drugs on Alaska citizens and communities.
As written, the Department of Health and Social Services will be in a secondary role to assist and cooperate with the Department of Public Safety in enforcement of this act. At this time, it appears that DHSS would be available to assist with education, notification to the Department of Public Safety of possible violations and other support roles, without the need
for additional resources.
