# STATE OF ALASKA 2014 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

# BILL NO. HB149

## Analysis

This bill amends AS 23.30.121(f) to include firefighters employed by the state.

The department currently provides medical examinations once every two years for firefighters. With the passage of this bill the department would be required to pay for yearly qualifying medical examinations under 8 AAC 45.093. These exams include numerous tests outside of the normal fitness for duty determination and are therefore significantly more expensive.

Positions effected by change (Airport Police & Fire Officers):	65
Current cost of medical examination per employee:	\$.6
Additional cost of qualifying medical examination per employee:	\$1.2
Additional need:	65 x \$1.2=\$78.0
