The Cook Inlet Aquaculture Association (CIAA) supports naming the Kasilof River Bridge the Michael G. Wiley Bridge.

CIAA conducts fishery enhancement projects throughout the Cook Inlet drainage and is governed by a volunteer Board of Directors dedicated to providing and protecting the salmon resources of Cook Inlet for all user groups. Board members also dedicate their time serving on various committees that provide additional guidance to the Association.

In 2012, CIAA lost Board member Mike Wiley who passed away in December. Mike was an active member of the Clam Gulch community, counting service to CIAA among one of his many volunteer commitments.
