

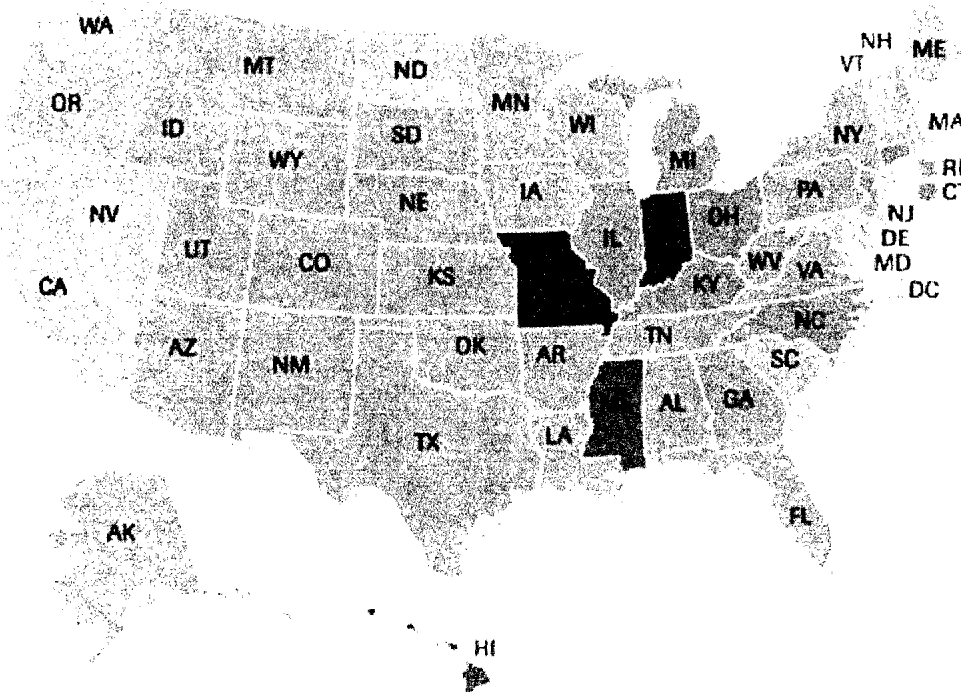
### Length of Time Before Tenure Kicks In
