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STATE OF ALASKA 2014 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

BILL NO. CSHB 169(L&C)

Analysis

HB 169 amends AS 42.05.145, a statutory section dealing with telecommunications regulation policy, by adding subsections (b) and (c), which when read together provide that the Regulatory Commission of Alaska will no longer have authority to regulate either the production or distribution of telephone directories in commission-designated competitive local exchange markets. A "competitive local exchange market" is defined in regulation (3 AAC 53.205) as "a local exchange or a group of local exchanges within one certificated service area where multiple unaffiliated telecommunications providers are certificated to provide local exchange service." Currently, the Commission has designated several local exchanges as competitive. Commission designation of competitive local exchange markets include by way of example the telecommunications markets in Fairbanks, the Mat-Su area, Anchorage, Seward/Moose Pass, and Juneau.

HB169 would leave to local exchange carriers operating in competitive markets the right to decide whether to publish telephone directories, what to include in them, whether to distribute free or at cost, and under what terms and conditions they will be available. Decisions about telephone directories would then be management decisions influenced by market conditions. Customers of wireline telephone service providers should expect to see changes in the availability and content of telephone directories.

Regulation revisions would be necessary to delete or revise a provision of regulation that now exists (3 AAC 52.250. Directories). This regulations project would not require an increase in staffing levels. The July 1, 2016 date by which the RCA would adopt, amend, or repeal regulations is an estimated date. In accordance with AS 42.05.175(e), the RCA would work to adopt, amend, or repeal regulations no later than 730 days after a rule-making proceeding is initiated.

There is no anticipated fiscal impact to the Regulatory Commission of Alaska from this bill.
