FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

**STATE OF ALASKA

BILL NO. SB 193

Analysis

The bill amends AS 08.18 to increase the dollar amounts for construction contractor and home inspector surety bonds and to establish an exception from liability and property damage insurance requirements for a contractor who does work with a contract price of \$2,500 or less. In addition, the bill repeals the exclusion from contractor licensing under AS 08.18.161(8) for work on a project that has an aggregate contract price of \$10,000.

The Department of Labor and Workforce Development provides contractor licensing enforcement services under a reimbursable services agreement with the Department of Commerce Community and Economic Development, Division of Corporations, Business and Professional Licensing. The department does not anticipate a significant fiscal impact as a result of the changes associated with the proposed legislation.
