Fish, forests, wildlife, grasslands, and all other replenishable resources belonging to the State shall be utilized, developed, and maintained on the sustained yield principle, subject to preferences among beneficial uses.







- <u>Habitat Protection</u>: Protect important fish and wildlife habitat during permit and project review










Alaska Department of Fish and Game Organizational Chart






FY2014 Budget By Division & Fund Source (\$214,949.7)




FY2014 Budgeted Positions



Department of Fish & Game's Budget Compared to All Agencies' Budgets (GF Only) (\$ Thousands)






Department of Fish & Game Percent of the Total Department's Budget by Fund Group


